



Pakistan and UAE Unlock New **Business, Investment Opportunities**

Both nations share a robust and multifaceted relationship, spanning diplomatic, economic, and cultural ties

AKISTAN and the UAE continue to deepen their economic partnership through enhanced collaboration in key sectors, including banking, mining, infrastructure development, and logistics, with growing interest in renewable energy, hospitality, and tourism, says a top diplomat.

Pakistan Ambassador to UAE Faisal Niaz Tirmizi said both countries aim to diversify trade and investment avenues, foster business partnerships, and leverage strategic complementarities to achieve sustainable economic growth and mutual prosperity.


"Both nations have signed multiple agreements to bolster cooperation in banking, mining, infrastructure development, and railways. Several Memoranda of Understanding (MoUs) are in the pipeline, covering multiple areas such as food security, science and technology, artificial intelligence (AI), tourism and culture. These agreements aim to deepen collaboration in emerging sectors and foster innovation-driven partnerships between Pakistan and the UAE," Tirmizi told Khaleej Times during an exclusive interview.

The ambassador said Pakistan and the UAE share a robust and multifaceted relationship, spanning diplomatic, economic, and cultural ties. He noted that the UAE is Pakistan's largest trading partner in the Middle East and the third largest globally, reflecting the depth of our economic engagement. Additionally, the UAE is a vital source of remittances, thanks to the significant Pakistani expatriate community residing there.

He also observed that the recent exchange of high-level delegations underscores the commitment of both nations to strengthening bilateral relations. Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif's participation in the World Governments Summit in February 2025, followed by the visit of Sheikh Khaled bin Mohamed Al Nahyan, Crown Prince of Abu Dhabi, along with a high-level delegation, highlights the mutual focus on enhancing economic cooperation and investment opportunities.

"As a result of these engagements, bilateral trade has grown by 28 per cent during the first eight months of the current financial year compared to the same period last year. This growth reflects expanding collaboration in key sectors such as infrastructure development, mining technology, and banking and finance," he said.

During the visit of Sheikh Khaled bin Mohamed bin Zayed Al Nahyan on February 27, 2025, both countries signed multiple MoUs to bolster cooperation in banking, mining, infrastructure development, and railways. This follows an earlier milestone on November 8, 2024. when four MoUs were signed between

Further strengthening logistics ties, DP World and Pakistan's National Logistics Corporation (NLC) launched the first feeder shipping service between Dubai's Jebel Ali Port and Karachi in January 2025, streamlining trade and cargo movement between the two countries.

The ambassador said several sectors hold significant potential for boosting UAE-Pakistan trade and investment:

Shipping and Logistics: Leveraging the strategic locations of both countries as regional trade hubs.

Banking and Financial Services: Expanding collaboration in fintech, Islamic banking, and investment financing.

Mining: Tapping into Pakistan's vast untapped mineral resources. **Healthcare:** Exploring joint ventures in

hospital management, pharmaceuticals, and medical tourism.

Railways and Aviation: Enhancing infrastructure development and operational efficiencies.

"By strengthening partnerships in these areas, Pakistan and the UAE can unlock new avenues for mutual growth and prosperity," he said.

OVERSEAS PAKISTANIS ROLE Tirmizi, an experienced diplomat, said the Pakistani community in the UAE plays a pivotal role in Pakistan's economy, with remittances exceeding \$5 bil-

lion last year. We anticipate this figure will reach \$6 billion this year. To send remittances through official channels, the Pakistani Missions in the UAE, in collaboration with the State Bank of Pakistan, National Bank of Pakistan, and exchange companies, regularly conduct awareness ses-

sions," he said. The government has also launched the Sohni Dharti Remittance Programme, a point-based loyalty initiative offering incentives such as duty payments, fee waivers for passport/NICOP, school fee payments at OPF schools, and discounts on PIA air tickets and extra luggage charges. These measures are expected to further increase remittance inflows in the com-

collaboration with Roshan Digital Account (RDA) banks, has introduced the Roshan Pension Plan (RPP), a voluntary pension scheme tailored for overseas Pakistanis. The RPP offers a range of investment options, including equity-based, debt-based, money market-based, and hybrid funds, allowing individuals to choose long-term financial goals.

Key features of the RPP include:

- Eligibility: Open to employed or selfemployed individuals above 18 years of age with a valid CNIC/NICOP and an RDA account.
- Contributions: Participants can start with as little as PKR 10,000.
- Additional Benefits: Insurance/ takaful protection and tax benefits as per Pakistani laws.

The RPP enables overseas Pakistanis to plan for their retirement conveniently from anywhere in the world, ensuring financial security in their later years.

RDA: A GAME-CHANGER

The Roshan Digital Account (RDA) has been a game-changer in formalising remittance flows and boosting Pakistan's economy, according to the ambassador.

"Pakistan has received the highest inflows of from the UAE under the Roshan Digital Account (RDA). To further enhance its appeal, the State Bank of Pakistan could consider adding features such as National Savings plans and prize bonds, which are highly trusted by overseas Pakistanis. These additions would provide more investment options and strengthen the RDA's value proposition,"

In reply to a question about some Pakistanis facing visa issues, the UAE remains a prime destination for expatriate workers, tourists, and investors, thanks to its diversified economy.

'While challenges exist, the future looks promising, particularly for skilled professionals in emerging sectors such as information technology, healthcare, renewable energy, and financial servic-

es," Tirmizi said.
"The Government of Pakistan is actively addressing visa-related challenges through governance reforms and human resource development initiatives. With the UAE's growing demand for skilled labour and Pakistan's efforts to streamline manpower movement, we are optimistic about improved visa facilitation soon," he said.

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

Innovative Solutions to Serve Community

Technology playing a key role in tackling the additional pressure of individuals visiting the consulate for various consular services

HE Pakistani Consulate in Dubai has been actively working to enhance the welfare of the Pakistani community despite multiple challenges including limited human resources and fi-

nances, its top official says. Hussain Muhammad, Consul-General of Pakistan Consulate Dubai, said his diplomatic mission adopts a multifaceted approach to cater to the issues of around 1.5 million Pakistanis residing in Dubai and Northern Emirates.

"We've been actively working to enhance the welfare of the Pakistani community residing in Dubai and the Northern Emirates through new initiatives. The Consulate is committed to providing the best possible support and continuously seeks innovative solutions to address the issues of the community," Muhammad told Khaleej Times during an interview.

Muhammad, a career diplomat who joined the Foreign Service of Pakistan in 2006, assumed the charge as Consul-General of Pakistan to Dubai and Northern Emirates in 2023. He had earlier served the consulate from 2011 to 2015.

The UAE is home to the second largest diaspora of Pakistanis and also a major trading partner of the country. Currently, there are 1.7 million Pakistanis residing in the UAE, with a majority of them in Dubai and Northern Emirates.

Excerpts from the interview:

Pakistani Community has increased manifold in the past few years, but the facilities at the Consulate remained the same. What is your strategy to handle additional pressure and facilitate Pakistani nationals at the Consulate?

Since 2022, the Pakistani Community in Dubai in particular, and in UAE in general, has increased by around half a million individuals. The consulate General is using technology to tackle the additional pressure of individuals visiting the Consulate for various consular services. The Consulate has started one window opera-

tion in Machine Readable Passport (MRP) section. This improvement has reduced the waiting time of the applicant up to four times. No applicant has to wait for more than one hour to get complete services.

Similarly, besides starting one window operation, the services in Nadra section have been streamlined through appointment system. The applicant can book appointment by visiting our website and visit for Nadra services on the specified date and time. These improvements ensured that additional number of applicant do not hamper the performance of the consulate.

In addition to the recent changes in the system, there is an option that applicants may apply for passport/NICOP renewal through using smart phone/computers without coming to the consulate.

What are the major steps taken by the Consulate recently for the welfare of Pakistani Community in Dubai and Northern Emirates?

The consulate has been actively working

to enhance the welfare of the Pakistani community residing in Dubai and the Northern Emirates. Recognising the challenges faced by expatriates, the consulate has undertaken several initiatives to provide support, assistance, and improve their quality of life.

- The consulate organises and participates frequently in community outreach programmes to engage with the Pakistani diaspora, address their concerns, and provide necessary assistance. These programmes include monthly e-Khuli Kacheri, meeting with prominent members of the community and other events arranged by Pakistani community members. The consulate has also created an awareness video for the consumption of Pakistani diaspora in UAE deliberating upon the rights and responsibilities of community members in UAE as per local laws. The video has been viewed over 100,000 times on social media platforms.
- Our community members face major issues in navigating through the legal

system of UAE. The mission has started focusing on provision of legal advice to the applicants as the hiring of lawyer and other legal services are extremely expensive in UAE. The legal section has provided legal advice to more than 300 applicants in last year which is greatly appreciated by the community members.

- Another important aspect which needed facilitation was the process for issuance of death NOCs. Keeping in view the urgency of death NOC, our welfare section staff is available 24/7 for issuance of death NOC. During the last year, the mission has issued 913 death NOCs and provided the coffin/embalming charges in deserving cases.
- The welfare section visits the prisons in Dubai and Northern Emirates every week on designated days and get consular access as per the requirements of the family members.
- The mission has engaged affluent members of the Pakistani community to bear educational fee of the needy children of the diaspora. Similarly, the mission has engaged the donors for provision of air tickets to the prisoners ready for deportation to Pakistan and more than 250 air tickets are provided. The mission also remain in touch with the hospitals and based on the recommendations of the hospital authorities, we have repatriated several patients to Pakistan through stretcher/ wheel chair facility during last year.

What are the major challenges faced by the consulate while addressing issues of Pakistani Community? The consulate faces several significant challenges while addressing the issues of the Pakistani community.

- a. One of the primary difficulties is the huge size of the community (around 1.5 million in Dubai and Northern Emirates), which includes individuals from various socio-economic backgrounds, each with unique needs and concerns. This diversity requires the Consulate to adopt a multifaceted approach to cater to everyone effectively with limited human resource and financial resources.
- b. Additionally, the legal complexities and the high cost of legal services in the UAE. make it difficult for many expatriates to navigate their issues in the matters pertaining to Prosecution and the Courts, necessitating the consulate to step in frequently with legal advice and support.
- c. Most of the Pakistani workers are not aware of their rights as per UAE local laws. Despite our repeated efforts to raise the awareness, the community members lands in trouble due to lack of awareness.
- In a nutshell, limited resources, funding and lack of awareness further constrain the consulate's ability to address all the community needs promptly. Despite these challenges, the consulate remains committed to providing the best possible support and continuously seeks innovative solutions to overcome these obstacles.

How do you see role of Commercial Section to promote UAE-Pakistan economic ties and facilitates Pakistani businessmen to connect with their counterparts in the emirate?

The UAE is transforming into a digital economy, and there is a potential of greater trade between Pakistan and the emirate. Pakistani companies regularly participate in several trade fairs in diverse sectors such as pharmaceuticals, cosmetics, agriculture/food, IT and confectionary. All these sectors provide opportunity for greater trade.

Government of Pakistan supports participation of Pakistani firms in several trade fairs in UAE. The trade wing of the consulate in coordination with the Ministry of Commerce extends full facilitation to exporting firms and their participation in these trade shows.

Moreover, several investment conferences have been organised by the Government of Pakistan in UAE in order to attract investments in Pakistan.

Gwadar International Airport: Pioneering a New Era of Trade

The development of airports reflects a broader vision — one that prioritises connectivity, economic growth, and technological advancement

HE strategic evolution of Gwadar has long been a subject of geopolitical and economic significance. With its deep-sea port positioned at the crossroads of major global trade routes, the city has been steadily transforming into a linchpin of regional commerce. Now, with the operationalisation of the New Gwadar International Airport (NGIAP) on January 20, 2025, this transformation has reached a pivotal moment.

A flagship project under the China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC), NGIAP is more than an infrastructure milestone — it is a statement of intent. Designed to integrate Gwadar into the global aviation network, the airport's impact is expected to ripple across multiple sectors, from trade and logistics to tourism and investment.

According to Saif Ullah, Additional Director of Public Relations at the Pakistan Airports Authority (PAA), NGIAP is set to redefine regional connectivity. "This airport is not just about passenger traffic - it is a strategic gateway that will enhance economic mobility, attract investment, and strengthen Pakistan's role in global commerce," he explains.

INFRASTRUCTURE **BUILT FOR THE FUTURE**

Spanning 4,300 acres, NGIAP is Pakistan's largest airport by land area and one of the most ambitious aviation projects undertaken in recent years. The terminal building, covering 15,000 square meters, is designed to handle 1.6 million passengers annually, with an initial capacity of 400,000 passengers per year.

Since its inauguration, the airport has already accommodated 22 international and 39 domestic flights, signalling a rapid integration into the aviation network. In the past month alone, private media reports indicate that 42 flights were operated, serving over 1,500 passengers — a strong indication of growing demand.

But NGIAP's significance extends far beyond commercial aviation. As a logistics and trade hub, its proximity to Gwadar Port, one of the deepest seaports in the world, positions it as a critical enabler of maritime and air trade linkages. "The synergy between Gwadar Port and NGIAP



will make this region a major node in global supply chains," says Saif Ullah.

The airport's economic impact is already evident. Employment opportunities for the local population have surged, with skilled and unskilled laborers finding work across multiple sectors — airport operations, hospitality, and transport. Moreover, with increasing flight operations and a bustling atmosphere of passengers, businesspeople, and traders, NGIAP is fostering a climate of commercial optimism. "The ripple effect of this airport will be felt in every sector - real estate, tourism, logistics, and retail," Saif Ullah notes.

While NGIAP is already operational, further enhancements are on the horizon. Discussions are underway to expand cargo handling facilities, optimise air traffic operations, and attract international carriers to establish direct routes to key Middle Eastern, Central Asian, and Chinese destinations.

At Allama Iqbal International Airport (AIIAP) in Lahore, a transformative expansion is underway. With a completion target of September 2026, the project includes an additional 350,000 square feet of terminal space, an apron expansion with two new bays for large aircraft, upgraded access roads, and a new sewage treatment plant.

The expansion is set to increase AIIAP's passenger capacity to 12 million annually, ensuring that Lahore remains a critical gateway for international and domestic travelers. Importantly, flight operations will remain uninterrupted, as the new infrastructure is being constructed alongside the existing terminal before integration.

"This project is designed to accommodate growth for the next 20 years, ensuring Lahore remains a key hub in Pakistan's aviation sector," explains Saif Ullah.

Islamabad International Airport is embracing cutting-edge Electronic Gates (e-Gates) to modernise Automated Border Control systems. This initiative, part of a broader technological overhaul at Karachi, Lahore, and Islamabad airports, is expected to be completed by January 2026.

The introduction of e-Gates will streamline immigration procedures, reducing processing time, enhancing security, and improving the overall passenger experience," Saif Ullah says. The move aligns Pakistan's aviation sector with global standards, ensuring seamless entry and exit for travelers, while also supporting business and tourism growth.

At Jinnah International Airport (JIAP) in Karachi, a Rs8.3 billion runway reconstruction project is in full swing. Launched on July 4, 2024, the project involves the complete reconstruction and extension of Runway 07L/25R, allowing it to accommodate ICAO Category 4F aircraft, including the Airbus A380.

The 18-month initiative, slated for completion by January 2026, includes: ■ Reconstruction of Taxiway Golf and

- construction of Taxiway Quebec ■ Installation of an advanced LED Category-I Airfield Lighting System
- Integration of a centralised Airfield Lighting Control and Monitoring System (ALCMS)

"These upgrades will ensure safe and efficient flight operations for the next 25-30 years, significantly enhancing runway capacity and operational efficiency," says Saif Ullah. The improvements will boost tourism, employment, and aviation revenues, reinforcing Karachi's status as Pakistan's most critical aviation hub.

As Pakistan undertakes an ambitious airport modernisation agenda, the developments at Gwadar, Lahore, Islamabad, and Karachi airports reflect a broader vision — one that prioritises connectivity, economic growth, and technological advancement. With Gwadar International Airport leading this transformation, the country's aviation sector is entering a new era - one defined by strategic infrastructure, enhanced operational efficiency, and an increasingly vital role in global trade and commerce.

PIA All Set to **Spread its Wings**

The airline will reinstate its routes to high-traffic destinations across the Middle East, Central Asia

HE Pakistan International Airlines (PIA), the national flag carrier of south Asian second biggest country, looks set to spread its wings by expanding its operations to UK and Central

Asian markets this year, its top official says. Air Vice Marshal (AVM) Amir Hayat, Chief Executive Officer of PIA, said the airline will reinstate its routes to hightraffic destinations across the Middle East and Central Asia.

"Following the successful resumption of flights to Europe, PIA is now exploring further expansion, particularly in UK and Central Asian Markets. In 2025, we plan to reinstate key routes in the UK, Gulf & Middle East and Centra Asia, particularly focusing on high-traffic destinations," Hayat told Khaleej Times.

"Additionally, we are exploring partnership opportunities to further expand our network spread via code share and alliances to a number of destinations in Africa, Europe, North America and Central Asia," he said.

About the resumption of flights to the United States, the Air Vice Marshal said it is on top of his agenda, but it will take some time. "Restoring PIA's presence in the United States is a key priority. However, this process involves rigorous regulatory approvals, particularly from the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) and the Transport Safety Administration (TSA).

'We are actively working with aviation authorities to ensure compliance with all international safety and operational standards. While no definitive timeline can be provided, we are optimistic about achieving this milestone in the near future."

REGAINING PAST GLORY

AVM Hayat said PIA's legacy as one of Asia's pioneering airlines remains a strong foundation for its revival.

"With the ongoing privatisation and restructuring efforts, the key to regaining our past glory lies in capitalising on operational efficiency, financial restructuring, and customer-centric policies. If the right reforms are sustained, PIA has the potential to reclaim its position as a leading carrier in the region," he said.





"There were many challenges as Pakistan is still raw when it comes to film production. Though recent hits like Maula Jatt have been produced, the industry still lacks financial support, tech-




nical expertise, and production skills. The government needs to step in to help the industry grow."



OR decades, Pakistan's health-care system has continuously struggled to provide adequate care, with an alarming 60 per cent of the population lacking access to essential health services. With insufficient funding, inefficient resource allocation, and a shortage of healthcare professionals, the country's healthcare infrastructure is highly underdeveloped.

The lack of access to basic healthcare services, particularly in rural areas, has resulted in poor health outcomes, high expenditures, and a significant burden on the country's economy. Pakistan's healthcare expenditure accounts for less than three per centof the country's GDP and has a shortage of 50,000 doctors and 100,000 nurses. Hence, providing quality care to a massive population of over 280 million people has become an almost insurmountable task.

The healthcare system in Pakistan is in dire need of reform, needing strict implementations of new healthcare facilities to alleviate the suffering of millions of its citizens. Basic Health Units (BHUs) and Rural Health Centres (RHCs) are one of the scarce facilities that provide basic healthcare, but unfortunately they are heavily underutilised due to lack of human capital, lack of education, and limited transportation options. People in rural villages cannot afford to walk miles and miles to visit a primary-care doctor, and instead suffer from preventable diseases for years.

Amidst these disheartening conditions, Indus Hospital & Health Network (IHHN) is a leading force in addressing systemic healthcare challenges, providing comprehensive, Free healthcare services across Pakistan and bringing positive change in the lives of millions. Offering services such as family medicine, paediatric cancer treatment, and surgeries, this modest hospital was the catalyst for a far-reaching impact, spark-

Notably, the Emergency Room is now operational with 84 beds and eight clinics, while 44 Filter Clinics and 28 OPD Clinics are set up and running.

From paperless facilities to electronic medical records to centralised monitoring systems, the new building's incredibly sophisticated and modern technology is finally accessible to the underprivileged, who rarely have access to such services. This long-standing disparity is now being bridged, with the fundamental right to quality healthcare being upheld

Additionally, IHHN's new building aims to resolve Pakistan's perennial struggle with a shortage of skilled medical professionals through the Indus University of Health Sciences (IUHS), a pioneering institution that trains healthcare professionals. This strategic initiative ensures a continuous and robust pipeline of healthcare providers, thereby fortifying the country's healthcare infrastructure.

AKISTAN has implemented decisive reforms to build a robust foundation for sustainable and inclusive development despite confronting formidable challenges. These include re-

formidable challenges. These include reforming an inequitable and distortive tax system, reducing inefficient expenditures and untargeted subsidies, lessening the large state presence in the economy, reducing barriers to trade and investment, and reducing losses in the energy sector.

Implementation of planned structural policy reforms, supported by a strong national political consensus and increased private sector participation, is critical to mitigate risks, support stronger privateled growth and poverty reduction. Today, the results of these efforts are becoming evident, with the economy demonstrating resilience and renewed potential.

Pakistan's approach to economic stabilisation offers valuable insights for other developing nations. The government's commitment to reform has paved the way for a transformative journey toward sustainable growth. Central to these efforts is 'Uraan Pakistan', an economic transformation initiative launched in 2024. This programme targets a six per cent GDP growth by 2028 through public-private partnerships, enhancing export competitiveness, and optimising public finances. Priority sectors under this initiative include agriculture, energy, textiles, pharmaceuticals, and information technology.

A cornerstone of *Uraan Pakistan* is a \$20 billion collaboration with the World Bank, focusing on health, education, poverty alleviation, investment, and climate resilience. This partnership addresses critical issues like child malnutrition, educational outcomes, and clean energy adoption. By integrating sustainability into its develop-

ment agenda, Pakistan is aligning with global efforts to achieve the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals. The fiscal year 2023-24 was particularly challenging for Pakistan, with inflation soaring to a record 38 per cent and foreign exchange reserves depleting to levels sufficient to cover only two weeks of essential imports. These conditions strained households, eroded purchasing power, and hindered economic activity. The compounded effects of Covid and devastating floods, which caused over \$30 billion in damages, further tested the nation's resilience.

Recognising the urgency, the government implemented a series of necessary reforms, stabilising the exchange rate, tightening fiscal policies, and curbing inflation through targeted monetary interventions. With support from the IMF's \$7 billion Extended Fund Facility (EFF), Pakistan initiated structural re-

forms in energy and taxation sectors.

In July 2024, a reform-oriented budget was introduced, aiming to raise Rs13 trillion in revenue — a 40 per cent increase from the previous year. These reforms focused on broadening the tax base by targeting under-taxed sectors such as agriculture, real estate, and trade, while leveraging technology to enhance compliance and transparency. Modernisation of the Federal Board of Revenue (FBR) has been instrumental in streamlining tax administration.

The results of these reforms are evident. The current account has been in surplus for consecutive months, and investor confidence is at a two-year high. Foreign Direct Investment (FDI) has increased by 20 per cent in the first half of the fiscal year 2024-25, reflecting renewed trust in Pakistan's economic trajectory.



Forests are Not Just Resources but Lifelines

top official says. Ali Amin Khan Gandapur, Chief Minister, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, said KP stands as Pakistan's Carbon Sink, with 37 per cent of its land is reserved for forests and national parks, removing 50 per cent of the nation's carbon emissions.

"With 40 per cent to 45 per cent of Pakistan's total forest cover, KP plays a crucial role in climate mitigation. However, conservation comes at a cost, with Rs3 billion spent annually on deforestation control and equivalent of Rs319 billion required for protection efforts — directly or indirectly into protecting and maintaining the forest of the size of the one that KP has," Gandapur told Khaleej Times during an exclusive interview.

Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, the third-largest province of Pakistan by population and the smallest province by area, has a varied geography of rugged mountain ranges, valleys, rolling foothills, and dense agricultural farms. It is bordered by Balochistan to the south; Punjab, Islamabad Capital Territory, and Azad Kashmir to the east; and Gilgit-Baltistan to the north and northeast. It shares an international border with Afghanistan to the west.

INVESTING IN GREEN ENERGY

Since 2017, the Chief Minister said KP has allocated Rs675 billion for development projects that support forestation and afforestation efforts — directly or indirectly, yet sustainable funding remains essential. To maintain this momentum, the Chief Minister of KP advocates for a 10 per cent share of the National Finance Commission (NFC) award for forest conservation, following the successful model of India, where allocations increased from 7.5 per cent to 10 per cent.

"Our forests hold the potential to gen-



erate approximately Rs38 billion in voluntary carbon credits and approximately Rs115 billion in compliance markets, reinforcing the need for national and international support. By rewarding provinces for conservation efforts, we can ensure long-term ecological and economic benefits," Gandapur said.

"In our first year in government, we have launched another ambitious project, Billion Trees Plus at an estimated cost of Rs7.5 billion to enhance KP's forest cover beyond 26 per cent. At the same time, we are investing in green energy through investments in hydropower and shifting our government institutes on solar power, including schools, colleges, universities, hospitals as well as other facilities," the Chief Minister said.

Billion Trees Tsunami project was originally launched by former Prime Minister Imran Khan in 2015 to turn the tide on land degradation and loss in the mountainous, formerly forested KP province in the Hindu Kush Mountain range. The then provincial government of PTI had claimed that one billion trees were planted.

The 'Billion Trees Plus' campaign is in full swing with senior officials of the district administration distributing saplings among departments in the district. According to the district administration, the drive has been launched in line with provincial government directives to increase forest cover and ensure a clean and healthy environment for citizens.

"This ambitious project aims to not only plant trees but also protect and restore entire ecosystems, while creating green jobs and improving livelihoods in the region," according to an official.

Gandapur said KP's vision for a greener future includes incentivising forest budgets, promoting reforestation, compensating conservation trade-offs, and supporting local communities with healthcare, education, and employment.

"With collaborative efforts, we can protect our forests, strengthen Pakistan's resilience to climate change, and build a more sustainable future for generations to come," the Chief Minis-

The successful launch of the Electro-Optical-1 (EO-1) observation satellite is more than a technical feat; it is a symbol of the country's aspirations to embrace innovation and harness advanced technologies for sustainable development and national progress.

On January 17, Pakistan reached new heights by launching its first domestically developed EO-1 satellite from China's Jiuquan Satellite Launch Centre. This historic event, broadcast live from Pakistan's Space and Upper Atmosphere Research Commission (SUPARCO) Karachi complex, filled Pakistanis with pride as they witnessed their nation take a bold step toward space exploration. The achievement also highlighted the deepening cooperation between Islamabad and Beijing, underscoring the strategic partnership's significance in advancing space technology.

The EO-1 satellite, developed entirely by Pakistani engineers under the guidance of the SUPARCO, marks a pivotal moment in Pakistan's scientific journey. Its successful deployment aboard China's Long March 2D (LM-2D) rocket represents a quantum leap in Pakistan's space programme. Designed to bolster Earth observation capabilities, EO-1 aims to support critical areas such as agriculture, urban planning, disaster management, and environmental monitoring. This

China to Welcome First Pakistani Astronaut

By offering access to its space programme, China strengthens its ties with Pakistan while positioning itself as a champion of technological inclusivity for the Global South

CHINA'S Tiangong space station is on the verge of a historic milestone, as it prepares to host its first foreign visitor — a Pakistani astronaut. This unprecedented collaboration, cemented through a high-level agreement, will mark Pakistan's entry into human spaceflight and further solidify the strategic partnership between Beijing and Islamabad. The "Agreement on the Selection and Training of Pakistani Astronauts and Their Participation in China's Space Station Missions" was signed earlier this March between the China Manned Space Engineering Office

(CMSEO) and Pakistan's Space and Upper Atmosphere Research Commission (SUPARCO). The agreement underscores a shared ambition: training and deploying Pakistani astronauts to the Tiangong space station, which has been in orbit for nearly four years.

The signing ceremony, held at the Prime Minister's Office in Islamabad, was attended by Pakistani Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif. The initiative is a landmark for Tiangong to host non-Chinese astronauts, a move that aligns with Beijing's broader space diplomacy.

Under the agreement, the selection and training of Pakistani astronauts will take approximately a year. The chosen candidates will travel to China for an intensive regimen designed to prepare them for the rigors of spaceflight. The first hurdle they must overcome is learning Mandarin, as Chinese is the operational language aboard Tiangong. While they are expected to possess strong physical and psychological endurance, the training will further refine their adaptability to microgravity.

achievement showcases Pakistan's growing technical expertise and commitment to self-reliance in cutting-edge scientific endeavours. As the nation embarks on this ambitious path, it signals a brighter future where science and technology drive development and innovation.

This capability will ensure faster and more effective responses to emergencies, potentially saving countless lives and reducing economic

losses. The satellite's ability to monitor vital natural resources, including minerals, oil, and gas reserves, further strengthens its role in fostering sustainable development. By equipping policymakers with precise data, EO-1 represents a crucial tool in Pakistan's journey toward environmental stewardship and resource conservation. The capabilities make the satellite a vital tool for sustainable development and informed decision-making.

Globally, the earth observation satellite industry is experiencing exponential growth. Valued at \$5 billion in 2023, the market is projected to exceed \$8 billion by 2033, according to Novaspace.

reaching the Moon may sound beyond the realm of possibility. As global space exploration accelerates, Pakistan is making slow but steady progress in its space endeavors. In a landmark development underscoring the deepening collaboration, Pakistan and China have signed an agreement to send the first Pakistani astronaut into space. This historic accord not only signifies Pakistan's inaugural human spaceflight but also marks a significant milestone in the nation's space endeavours. If this mission succeeds, it could pave the way for more ambitious ventures, including lunar exploration. With China-Pakistan collaborations, the dream of a Pakistani astronaut stepping onto the lunar surface may not

remain a distant fantasy.

While this might not happen in the immediate future, it is a goal that could be

realised in the coming decades.

I have played a key role in transforming the hospitality industry with groundbreaking sustainability initiatives, particularly compost machines, advanced water filtration technology and air-to-water technology. The recent compost machine has been installed in Coral Beach Resort Sharjah early 2025, this follows my first sustainability project launched in 2012, marking over a decade of leadership in eco-friendly hotel operations. The compost machine efficiently processes organic waste, including food scraps, convert-

 $ing \ them \ into \ nutrient-rich \ compost.$

I achieved a major milestone by installing two advanced onsite water bottling plants, each utilising a different process but sharing the same mission - reducing single-use plastic bottles. Such are the advanced water filtration technology, significantly reducing plastic waste by providing reusable glass bottles, preventing approximately 300,672 plastic bottles from entering the environment annually. Second is the integration of air-to-water technology, extracting moisture from the air and converting it into clean drinking water. The state-of-the-art bottling plant produces an impressive 365,000 litres of pure drinking water annually by harnessing atmospheric moisture and eliminating 431,304 plastic bottles.

To further intensify the environmental and sustainability campaign with initiatives like compost machines and advanced onsite water bottling plants, a multi-faceted approach is the key. Collaborating with local governments, industry players and environmental organizations to create a unified green strategy will facilitate the widespread implementation of these initiatives.

Additionally, incorporating ISO 14001:2015 into the environmental and sustainability campaign is a strategic move to intensify and formalise efforts which are on our pipeline.

What do you say on the eve of Pakistan Resolution Day? Any message for strengthening the UAE-Pakistan bilateral relations?

On the eve of Pakistan Resolution Day, we celebrate the spirit of determination and unity that shaped a nation. The UAE and Pakistan share deep-rooted ties built on mutual respect, economic cooperation, and cultural affinity.





Driving Future: Punjab's Bold Leap Towards Green, Smart Transport

From metros to electric buses and breathtaking glass train - Punjab is redefining public transport for a sustainable connected future

S THE country marks Paki-

stan Day, Punjab is on the cusp of a transformative era in public transport. With a forward-looking five-year plan, the province is set to redefine ur-

ban mobility, embracing modern infrastructure, eco-friendly solutions, and enhanced road safety. From expanding Lahore's metro network to introducing electric buses and launching a first-ofits-kind glass train from Islamabad to Murree, the government is laying the groundwork for a sustainable, efficient, and inclusive transport system.

"Public transport is not just about mobility; it's about progress," says Imran Sikandar Baloch, Secretary Transport Department, Punjab. "We are committed to building a world-class, eco-friendly transit system that meets the needs of our growing urban population while aligning with global sustainability goals."

LAHORE'S METRO EXPANSION: A GAME-CHANGER MOVE

Lahore's metro system, already serving thousands daily through the Orange and Green Lines, is set to expand with three new metro routes:

Blue Line: A 27-kilometre metro from Valencia Town to Babu Sabu Chowk, designed to cater to over 250,000 daily passengers. The billions worth project is expected to be completed within three years, reducing congestion and providing a faster, more efficient travel option. Purple Line: A new corridor running along Canal Road, connecting Allama Iqbal International Airport to the city's heart, ensuring smooth connectivity for residents and visitors alike.

Yellow Line: Another proposed route along Canal Road from Thokar Niaz Baig, reinforcing Lahore's public transport network.

'These three lines are a major milestone," Baloch explains. "It will not only cut travel time but also reduce urban congestion."

To support these projects, the Punjab Transport Department is conducting feasibility studies and design planning, ensuring state-of-the-art technology is incorporated to enhance commuter experience.

Electric Buses (EVs)

CLEAN TRANSPORT

With the global push to reduce carbon emissions by 45 per cent by 2030, Punjab aims to cut its transport-related emissions by 15 per cent. A key part of this shift is the transition to electric buses and reducing reliance on fuel-powered vehicles.

Lahore has launched first electric bus service with 27 buses, offering a highly affordable fare. Additionally, 500 more electric buses are set to be introduced by August, marking a significant expansion of eco-friendly transport options. Also, mass transit for Faisalabad and Gujranwala are underway to extend Metrobus services to these cities, tackling congestion and pollution. Furthermore, electric vehicles (EVs) rollout in key cities like Rahim Yar Khan, DG Khan, Jhelum, and Sargodha to receive electric buses, furthering Punjab's green transport agenda.

"The shift to EVs is a priority," says Baloch. "By moving towards electric public transport, we are significantly cutting emissions while providing people with affordable and efficient mobility options."

Additionally, the government's EV policy is aimed at phasing out traditional rickshaws and bikes, replacing them with clean energy vehicles.

EXPANDING MASS TRANSIT ACROSS PUNJAB

Beyond Lahore, Punjab is scaling up its public transport network in Faisalabad and Gujranwala, where mass transit fea-

sibility studies are underway. However, due to the land acquisition process and infrastructure development, officials estimate the timeline for completion to be between 1.5 and 3 years.

"Building modern transit systems is a complex but necessary challenge," Baloch acknowledges. "These projects will not only make commuting easier but also stimulate economic growth and job creation in the region.'

A SPECTACULAR VISION: THE ISLAMABAD-MURREE **GLASS TRAIN**

While Punjab's urban transit plans focus on efficiency, the Glass Train project from Islamabad to Murree aims to offer a unique travel experience, reports local media. Currently in the pre-feasibility stage, this scenic railway route will provide passengers with unmatched pan-

oramic views of the lush hills and valleys. Unlike conventional trains, the Glass Train will feature transparent, reinforced glass coaches, allowing passengers to immerse themselves in the natural beauty of Murree as they travel. The project, once greenlit, will offer a safe, scenic, and eco-

friendly alternative to road travel along

with reduced road congestion in peak tourist seasons and boosted local tourism and economic activity.

The feasibility study is currently assessing railway tracks, station locations, geological risks, and environmental impact to ensure the train operates safely and sustainably. Given Murree's protected ecosystem, authorities are conducting environmental impact assessments to minimise disruption to the natural landscape.

Once operational, the Glass Train is expected to revolutionise travel to Murree, offering a quicker, safer, and more visually stunning journey compared to conventional road transport.

BEYOND TRANSPORT:

STRENGTHENING INSTITUTIONS & ROAD SAFETY

While infrastructure development is crucial, Punjab's transport vision also focuses on improving Road Safety through better traffic management systems and enhanced enforcement of regulations, leveraging Technology to enhance real-time traffic monitoring, ensuring smoother city-wide transit operations and building institutional capacity to ensure public transport projects are efficiently managed, sustained, and continuously improved.

"Strong institutions and road safety measures are just as important as the transport networks themselves," notes Baloch. "We are ensuring that Punjab's transport future is built on a foundation of efficiency, sustainability, and safety."



gettable moments.



A philanthropist at heart, Sehrish travels to remote villages in Pakistan to preserve the dying art of hand embroidery. By engaging women from underprivi-



Recounting the Years:

Saadat Hussein's Journey in the **UAE Since 1979**

began his career as a marketing executive at Al-Futtaim Motors - Toyota before transitioning to banking, joining Mashreq Bank (then known as Oman Bank). Over the next 32 years, Hussein held various positions at the bank, ultimately retiring in 2017 as regional head for Asia in the financial institution's division. With over three decades of service, he is regarded as one of the most experienced members of Dubai's banking community.

Now working as a financial consultant in Dubai, Hussein reflects on the city's remarkable transformation in the business sector as well as the ever-growing Pakistani community.

A DIFFERENT DUBAI

was very different and sparsely populated," he recalls. "There were only two main districts — Deira and Bur Dubai — where most commercial activities took place. Expats preferred to live in these areas to be close to their workplaces."

At the time, key projects such as Al Ghurair Centre, Deira Tower, Mansoor Tower, Hyatt Regency and Galleria were under construction, while landmarks like the Dubai World Trade Centre and Dubai Municipality building were completed and awaiting their inauguration by Queen Elizabeth II in February 1979.

"There were only two five-star hotels in the city, and Dubai did not have a single shopping mall until 1981, when Al Ghurair Centre opened. It quickly became a central hub for shoppers," he says.

In those early days, all major banks, government offices and multinational companies were concentrated in Deira. Most prominent UAE nationals, businessmen and expatriates also lived in Deira and Bur Dubai, making them the most sought-after localities.

HEALTHCARE, TRANSPORT AND EDUCATION

Despite Dubai's small size at the time, Hussein notes that healthcare services were always of a high standard. "Medical facilities in the UAE were excellent, and healthcare was free for all residents, including expatriates."

Public transport was reliable and affordable, with people commuting across the city and to other emirates via taxis and buses. However, international schools were limited.

"Until the early 1990s, expatriate families struggled with schooling options," he says. "Some of the well-known schools at the time included the American School, Dubai College, Emirates International, Indian High School, Pakistan School, Our Own English High School and Choueifat. Many expats sent their children back to their home countries for education due to the lack of schools.'

Today, the UAE offers world-class education at all levels, with a wide range of international curricula available.

A GLOBAL HUB

Until the mid-1990s, more than 75 per cent of residents and tourists in the UAE were from Asia, the Middle East and Africa. However, the demographics changed rapidly in the late 1990s as more people recognised the UAE's potential.

'The UAE became an attractive destination for professionals due to its global connectivity, safety, security, modern infrastructure and tax-free working environment," Hussein says.

Today, the country stands as a global business and tourism hub, with a diversified economy and cutting-edge infrastructure.

LAND OF OPPORTUNITIES

"The UAE is a land of opportunity for anyone with the ambition to grow

in their field," he says. 'The country provides excellent infrastructure and extensive support

By managing stress, cultivating a positive mindset, and supporting the body's natural healing abilities, holistic wellbeing serves as a powerful tool in reducing the risk of illness and improving quality of life."

It is based on the understanding that the body has an inherent and intelligent healing mechanism that thrives when given the right conditions - stillness, balance, and mindful awareness. At the core of holistic wellbeing is mindfulness, the ability to be present and in tune with oneself, which helps maintain equilibrium across physical, mental, and emotional systems."


